



Maria João Rodrigues, MEP

Maria Joao Rodrigues is currently a Member of the European Parliament and Vice President of the S&D Group for Social and Economic Model. Before she was Minister of Employment in Portugal and has been a policy maker working in the EU institutions since 2000. In academic terms she was a professor of European Economic Policies at the European Studies Institute- Université Libre de Bruxelles and the Lisbon University Institute. She was also the chair of the European Commission Advisory Board for socio-economic sciences.



Elisa Ferreira, MEP

Elisa Ferreira became a Member of the European Parliament in 2005 and is the S&D Coordinator of the Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs. She graduated in economics from the University of Oporto in 1977 and holds a MA and PhD from the University of Reading. She has been a lecturer at the Faculty of Economics of the University of Oporto since 1977. She was Minister of the Environment in Portugal from 1995 to 1999 and a Minister for Planning from 1999 to 2002.



Jutta Steinruck, MEP

Jutta Steinruck became a Member of the European Parliament in 2009 and is the S&D Coordinator of the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs. She graduated in economics from the Mannheim Vocational Academy in 1987. She held the position of Chair of the DGB trade union federation for the Vorder- un Südpfalz district in Rhineland-Palatinate between 2004 and 2011.

Xavier Timbeau holds the position of head of the Forecast and Analysis Department at the OFCE. He has experience in macro-economic analysis, economic forecasts, economic modelling and applied econometrics. He has served as an advisor to a considerable number of European and national institutions, think tanks, foundations and political parties.
